

Cambridge English: Digital Teacher Scholarship 2018

[The Digital Teacher](#) has been designed and developed by a team of experts in teacher training, teacher development and educational technology at Cambridge English Language Assessment. We aim to provide effective digital pedagogy in order to help teachers and learners benefit from the advantages provided by new technologies. All professional development resources on The Digital Teacher are free, available to individuals, and underpinned by the [Cambridge English Digital Framework](#).

For this scholarship we would like you to show us how you would use a digital tool or resource to enhance language learning in your context.

This scholarship, funded by Cambridge English Language Assessment, gives the opportunity for anyone with an interest in continuous professional development to attend the IATEFL Annual Conference in Brighton, UK in 2018.

The award consists of:

- registration for the Learning Technologies Special Interest Group (LTSIG) pre-conference event
- registration for the main conference
- a year's IATEFL membership
- a maximum of five nights' accommodation
- travel costs including, if necessary, an economy flight to the UK*
- £55.00 per day expenses

*This includes the cost of flights and airport transfers. Cambridge English Language Assessment will not cover the costs of stopovers.

To qualify you must:

- work in the fields of English language teaching, training or language assessment

To be considered you must:

- Complete the following task and send it to events@CambridgeEnglish.org:
 1. Explore our Digital Teacher tips on using [automated speech recognition](#), [virtual reality](#), and [artificial intelligence](#) to enhance language learning and choose a digital tool or resource that you could use in your teaching or teacher-training context.
 2. Design a 30 to 45 minute activity using the digital tool or resource that you have chosen, using the *Cambridge English Digital Teacher Scholarship Form* (available to download within the online application form) to write your plan.
- Submit a summary (400-500 words) as part of the online application process to reflect on your experience. Either:
 - a. try out the activity in class and complete the *Reflections* activity, or
 - b. if you are unable to try out your activity before you submit your scholarship application, complete the *Next steps* activity.
- a passport size photo (for inclusion in the conference programme and on the scholarship poster if you win – remember to smile! Please refer to the General Guidelines for full photo requirements)

The submission deadline is **16.00 (UK time) on Tuesday 18th July 2017**. Early submissions are very welcome; late submissions will not be considered.

The results will be announced between **Monday 28th August 2017** and **Thursday 7th September 2017**. Please do NOT contact the IATEFL Head Office about scholarship decisions; the Scholarship Working Party (SWP) will send everyone the results as soon as they are available.

Any content produced by Cambridge English Language Assessment which is similar to your submission is entirely coincidental.
